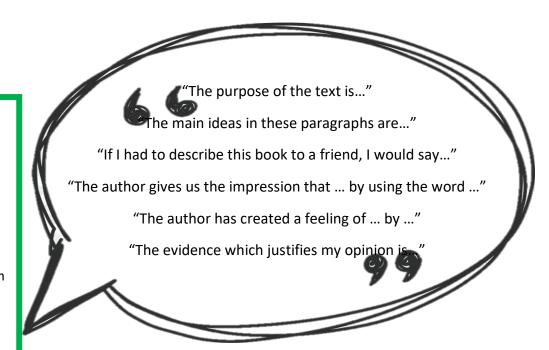

## In Year 4, you learnt to:

- Read all Y3/Y4 common exception words
- Discuss and compare texts from a wide variety of genres and writers
- Identify themes, conventions and authorial styles and features in texts
- Identify and summarise ideas from more than one paragraph
- Discuss vocabulary used to capture readers' interest and imagination
- Draw inferences from characters' feelings, thoughts and motives, using evidence from the text
- Use dictionaries to check the meaning of the words

<ul> <li>To read most words fluently and attempt to decode and unfamiliar words with increasing speed and skill, recognising their meaning through contextual cues.</li> <li>To apply growling knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes/word endings, including sion, -tion, -cial, -tial, -ant/-ance/-ancy, -ent/-ence/-ency, -able/-ably and -ible/ibly, to read aloud fluently.</li> <li>To read many Y5/Y6 exception words, discussing the unusual correspondences between spelling and sound and where these occur in the word.</li> </ul>	•	To read a wide range of genres, identifying the characteristics of text types and differences between text types.  To participate in discussions about books that are read to them and those they can read for themselves, building other their own and others' ideas and challenging views courteously.  To identify the main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph and to summarise these.  To recommend texts to peers based on personal choice.  To discuss vocabulary used by the author to create effect including figurative language.  To evaluate the use of authors' language and explain how it has created an impact on the reader.  To draw inferences from characters' feelings, thoughts and motives.  To make predictions based on details stated and implied, justifying them in detail with evidence from the text.
