## **Next Step Prompt Questions**

- Can the child talk about what they notice?

- Can the child talk about the roles of people around them?
- Can the child explain what the past and the present is?
- Can the child begin to organise things using basic chronology, e.g. today, yesterday?
- Can the child talk about experiences they have had, and how this might differ from the past?
