

LKS2 Football Football in LKS2 will build on the core skills learnt in KS1. The children will also look at tactics, playing the ball through a defensive line, man marking and zonal marking and volleys as well as playing in competitive games. Volley - Any ball kicked by a player when it is off the ground. Yellow card -A playing card-sized card that a referee holds up to warn a player for dangerous or unsportsmanlike behaviour; also called a caution; 2 yellow cards in one game earns a player an automatic red card, signalling his removal from the game. Zone -A type of defence that assigns each defender to a particular area in front of or around his team's goal in which he is responsible for marking any attacker that enters. Set play-A planned strategy that a team uses when a game is restarted with a free kick, penalty kick, corner kick, goal kick, throw-in or kickoff. Dribbling - A way of moving the ball along the ground by using the feet while keeping the ball under player's control.
